Fairly good general demand for the 268,995 packages (17.79m/kgs) in the market with 34.04% remaining unsold.

Brighter – Most teas held value but select lines advanced by USC10 and USC20.

Lower Medium – Mainly firm to USC10 above previous levels with a few teas appreciating by USC18 but select invoices lost up to USC27.

Regional Weather Conditions and World Crop

Kenya: Muranga: There were cold and sunny intervals during the day. Cool temperatures were recorded, maximum 21°c and minimum 9°c. No rainfall was recorded. Crop intake was at an averaged 54.8 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

Nyeri: The week was generally a bit cloudy. There was 3 mm of rainfall recorded in four wet days. The highest and lowest temperatures were 23°C & 12°C respectively. Crop intake averaged 32 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

Meru: The weather was sunny mornings with partly cold and cloudy afternoons. The weekend reported warmer weather. No rains were received through the week. The average temperatures recorded were 26°C & 13°C. Crop intake averaged 46 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

Sotik: The week experienced cloudy and cold conditions with moderate rainfall. The area received 30mm of rainfall in 2 wet days. The highest and lowest temperatures were 26°C & 11°C respectively. Factory utilization remained at last week's levels.

Kericho: The area experienced a slightly warm week with reduced precipitation. An average rainfall of 0.5 mm was received. Average temperatures were highs of 23° Celsius and lows of 10° Celsius. Crop intake went up by 25% compared to previous week's levels.

Weather review

Kenya: The crop is fair with the ongoing rains in most tea estates, however the crop prospects in most of the areas is on the decline due to the onset of the cold season. Also most areas have embarked on pruning which will significantly affect the available crop.

Uganda: Crop levels are maintained at last week's levels.

Malawi: Crop continues to decline.
