# Tea Market Report: Sale 35 of 28th - 30th August 2023

Strong demand for the 208,059 packages (13.91m/kgs) available in the market at irregularly dearer levels; 36.70% remained unsold.

### Leaf Grades (M2)

**Offerings:** 112,120 packages (7.33 m/kgs) – 43.13% unsold.

#### BP1

**Best** – Met more but irregular enquiry ranging between steady to up to USC132 above previous rates to easier by up to USC66.

**Brighter** – Improved interest advancing by up to US36.

**Mediums** – KTDA mediums mostly sold firm but a few lines were USC10 above last rates; plantation mediums met irregular enquiry ranging between steady to USC2 dearer with select Invoices advancing by up to USC73 but a few lines shed up to USC20.

**Lower Medium** – Were firm to USC25 dearer but a few lines lost up to USC16.

**Plainer** – irregular interest at steady to USC10 below last levels.



In the Secondary Catalogues, BPs were steady with PFs firm. Clean well sorted coloury Fannings gained while similar DUSTs held value. Other Fannings were steady with DUSTs firm. BMFs were readily absorbed.

### Markets

Plainer - Were irregular and ranged Kazakhstan, other CIS states, Sudan, Pakistan Packers and Afghanistan lent strong support while UK and Egyptian Packers maintained activity. Yemen, other Middle Eastern countries and Russia improved enquiry with Bazaar active. Iran were quiet packages while Local Packers maintained interest. Somalia were active at the lower end of the market.



olombo: at Sale 33 of 22nd and 23rd August, 2023 there were 5.3 m/kgs on offer. The 0.74Mkg of Ex-Estate teas on offer met with improved demand. Select Best Western High Grown BOPs gained, however the below best and plainer sorts were mostly firm to irregular. Select Best Western High Grown BOPFs appreciated from last levels together with the below best and plainer sorts. Nuwara Eliya BOP/ BOPF were tending irregular following quality. Well-made Uda Pussellawa BOPs appreciated, the others were firm, wellmade Uda Pussellawa BOPFs together with the below best and poorer sorts gained from last levels. Seasonal Uva BOPs continued to meet with good demand, the BOPFs too maintained last levels, coloury BOPs were firm to dearer, whilst the BOPFs followed a similar trend. All CTC BP1s were irregularly dearer. Low Grown CTC PF1s were firm, the High and Medium sorts appreciated substantially. The 2.3Mkg of Low Grown teas on offer met with improved demand. In the Leafy segment, OP/OPA's were dearer. OP1s met with fair demand. BOP1s were firm. Well-made PEKs were dearer, PEK1s maintained last levels. In the Small Leaf segment, well-made FBOPs were dearer. Well-made FF1s declined a few rupees. others too followed a similar trend. FF varieties showed improved interest. BOPF.SP. BOPF, BOP.SP and BOP grades met with good demand. Premium flowery teas were dearer. Turkey, Russia and the C.I.S countries lent fair support. Iran showed improved interest. Libya and Iraq were active.

**C** hittagong: at Sale 17 of 21st August, 2023, CTC LEAF: 62,068 packages of teas on offer met with less demand with prices easing further. BROKENS: All Broken grades met with less demand and prices eased further in line with quality. There were heavy withdrawals. BLF teas met with fair interest but there were heavy withdrawals. FANNINGS: There were only a few bright Fannings which were well supported at much easier rates often dropping by Tk.5/- and more. All other varieties met with only a fair demand and prices eased further with more withdrawals. BLF teas met with fair interest but there were heavy withdrawals. CTC DUST: 14,025 packages of teas on offer met with fair demand. Good liquoring Dusts were irregular and sold at easier levels. Mediums were also easier by Tk.5/to Tk.10/- closely following quality. Plain and BLF Dusts met with a limited demand and again saw heavy withdrawals. Blenders lent good support with fair interest from the Loose tea buyers. COMMENTS: Offerings were the highest so far this season and in the face of reduced competition,

Mediums and plainer sorts sold irregularly around last levels. Buying pattern: Major packeteers and Internal buyers operated.

alcutta: at Sale 34 of 22nd, 23rd and 24th August, 2023, there were 194,242 packages on offer. CTC: There was good demand but at lower levels than the previous week. All categories met with an easier market, with good & better-medium category Assams losing the most ground. All Dooars varieties were irregularly easier. 

### **Regional Weather Conditions and World Crop**

enya: Muranga: The weather was sunny throughout the week. No rainfall was experienced in the area. Cool temperatures were recorded, maximum 22°c and minimum 10°c. Crop intake was an average of 62.6 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

**Nyeri:** The week was generally sunny. There was no rainfall recorded throughout the week. The highest and lowest temperatures were 22°C & 12°C respectively. Crop intake averaged 32.6 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

**Meru:** The weather was warm and sunny throughout the week. There was no rainfall received throughout the week. The average temperatures recorded were 27°C & 11°C. Crop intake averaged 40 tonnes/day on a six day plucking cycle.

**Sotik:** The week experienced sunny and dry weather conditions with reduced showers. The rainfall received in one day was 3.5mm. The highest and lowest temperatures were 27°C & 11°C respectively. Factory utilization remained at last week's levels.

**Kericho:** Warmer week with reduced precipitations. Average rainfall of 2.4mm was recorded. Average temperatures were highs of 24° Celsius and lows of 10° Celsius.
